Transition for year 6

The process for transfer of pupils to secondary education has begun and all applications from current year 6 pupils need to be completed and returned to North Somerset by **23.59 hours, Tuesday 31 October**

2017. In addition, parents applying to St Bede's must complete the Additional Information Form and return it to St Bede's by 31 October.

Free School Meals & Census Day

Thursday 5 October is one of three school census days that occur throughout the year. Amongst other data that we are required to supply, the school has to report the number of school meals taken on census day. The census has an impact on the amount of funding received by the school and therefore the more children who have a school meal in KS1 on census day, the more funding the school receives. For parents of children in Years Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 there is no charge for school lunches as your child is entitled to Universal Infant Free School Meals, so please support the school and encourage your child to enjoy a delicious school meal this coming Thursday.

In addition to Universal Infant Free School Meals, extra funding is available to support children's learning experience throughout their school career if they are entitled to Free School Meals at the January census. This applies to children throughout the school in both KS1 and KS2. **Therefore it is beneficial to your child if you apply for Free School Meals even if your child is currently in Reception, Year 1 or Year 2 and receiving Universal Infant Free School Meals.**

North Somerset Council has recently changed the process for applications for Free School Meal entitlement. This must be completed at the beginning of every term online with an instant decision being given. If you think you may be entitled to Free School Meals for your child please follow the link <http://www.n-somerset.gov.uk/my-services/schools-learning/local-schools/schoolmeals/freeschoolmeals/> or come into the school office and we can assist you with your application.
